1. **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

The Nordics Open will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations

2024, the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Single & Pair Skating 2024, and all relevant ISU

Communications.

Participation in the Nordics Open is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule

108, paragraph 3 a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109,

paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2526 or any update of this Communication.

Passports/EU ID cards of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be

presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

All competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation.

The Nordics Open 2025 is organized by Asker Kunstløpklubb and the Norwegian Skating Association and

is organized as the same time as Nordics (Adv. Novice, only open to Nordic ISU members)

VENUE

Main arena (MR):

Varner Arena, Risenga idrettspark, An indoor ice-rink with the ice surface of 26 x 60 m, air-conditioned

and heated,

Practice rink (PR):

Askerhallen, Risenga idrettspark. An indoor ice-rink with the ice surface of 30 x 60 m, air-conditioned and

heated. The main arena and the practice rink are located side by side.

Citizen / Residence requirements and Clearance Procedure: In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of it, all skaters who do not have the Nationality of the Member, which they have been entered or who although having such nationality, have in the past representing another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.

Entries of officials

The host Nordic country member is responsible for appointing Referees and Technical panels for all categories, following initial suggestions from the Nordic country members as well as for the appointment of the Judges panels.

Each Nordic country member is responsible for providing at least one (1) international or ISU level judge, and at least one (1) technical panel member, but maximum two (2) Technical Controllers or Specialists. ISU members from outside the Nordics region can also propose judges. The Host country completes the panels of Officials according to the ISU Rules and relevant Communications regarding world standing points and officials' activity.

Entry fee

The entry fee is 75 € per skater and a minimum of 250 € per Nordic Member. In addition each Nordic country pays a contribution of 500 €.

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason. Entry fee must be paid by January 5 2025 through invoice to be sent out after the final entry day.

4. MUSIC & PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

Music files in mp3 format are requested to be uploaded on web links not later than January 5. See page 7. Each competitor must have an own back up-up drive (USB stick)with music files in the format of MP3. Each file must be clearly marked with: Name, category, country and type of program (SP/FS). Please note: CD:s will not be accepted. The Planned Program Content must also be entered by the ISU Member or the skater in the ISU portal.

5. ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

Meals

Teams can book meals, lunch and dinner, starting on Thursday lunch and ending with Sunday lunch except Friday dinner (banquet will be arranged). Meals can be booked at the Varner Arena or at Scandic Asker.

The Official Dinner

The Official Dinner for the Officials, coaches, team leaders and skaters will be held on Friday evening 19:30 at Scandic Hotel Asker. The dinner cost is 450 NOK/ person.

Meal tickets will be distributed to the Team Leaders at the time of registration according to bookings.

6. TRANSPORTATION

The closest international airport is Oslo international airport. From OSL there is approximately 45 minutes by train to Asker. The Organizer will not provide pick up service at the airport, since the public airport train and railway run frequently to/from Asker.

The railway station and the stop for the airport train are within walking distance to the official hotel.

Local transport

The Organizing Committee will provide shuttle transport between the Scandic Hotel Asker and the venue from Thursday morning to Sunday after VC.

7. PRACTICE

Official practice begins Thursday February 6 for all categories. There will also be possibilities for Unofficial practice for Junior and Senior Thursday. Please see details in the schedule.

The detailed practice schedules will be available after the final entry day

8. EXPENSES

Each participating Member must bear all expenses for their Competitors, Judges, Technical Panel (TC/TS/DO/RO), Team Leaders and Coaches. The meals (lunch and dinner) and pocket money for the Technical Panel members are borne by the Organizer.

If a Nordic country does not provide a judge and a technical panel person from their own country, the Country must cover the costs of one judge/technical panel person invited by the organizer. Travel and accommodation expenses will be paid only for the *invited* Referees, *invited* Technical Panel Members and *invited* Judges from outside Nordic countries.

REGISTRATION

Accreditation will be given to all Referees, Judges, Technical Panels, Competitors, Team Leaders, Coaches and Representatives from each Member Federation. Accreditation will be given at the Rink upon arrival.

STARTING ORDER AND DRAW

Judging and calculations will be done according to ISU Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024, Rules 352 and 353.

The draws will be conducted according to schedule and rule 512 and 513. The starting order for the Free Skating will be in reverse order of the result of the Short Program according to ISU Rule 513 2a. See schedule.

11. RESULTS

Judging and calculations will be done according to ISU Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024, Rules 352 and 353.

12. ISU WORLD STANDINGS/MINIMUM POINTS

World Standing Points will be awarded according to the "ISU World Standings Procedure", that can be found on the ISU website (www.isu.org) under Single & Pairs/Ice Dance – World Standings. (Comm.2550 or updated document). Nordics is listed here as an event not counting for points. Since the event now is open for all ISU Members it will count.

Minimum points will be possible to reach if the number of skaters and nations are according to rule 107, 3a).

13. AWARDS

The three best-placed Competitors in each event will be announced and honored at the official Victory Ceremony. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the medalists. The national anthem of the winner will be played.

14. LIABILITY

In accordance with ISU Rule 119, it is the sole obligation of each member participating in The Nordics 2024, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the

Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means. The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred by competitors and officials.

15. MEETINGS FOR EVENT OFFICIALS AND JUDGES

All referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data and Replay Operators and Judges are responsible for making their travel arrangements in order to be able to attend the respective event related meetings. See schedule in para. 17.
