

Open positions - figure skating coaches at Ishavsbyen Kunstløpklubb, Tromsø

Ishavsbyen Kunstløpklubb (IKK) was founded in 2010 and is possibly the worlds northernmost figure skating club. Ever since the very start of IKK, the club has experienced a steady growth in its member base, which currently counts over 80 active members across all levels, from skating school attendees to competitive skaters, and recreational senior members. IKK prides itself in offering coaching for skaters of all talents. The club has several skaters qualified for the 2022 national championships, and a youth generation with promising talent.

The club currently employs four part-time coaches including head coach. The club also employs two assistant coaches.

IKK is now looking to employ 1-2 new coaches depending on individual capacity. Full time employment is a possibility for educated coaches. Students currently (or soon to be) enrolled at the University of Tromsø (UiT), are encouraged to apply for part-time positions. Tromsø ice rink is only a 5 minute walk away from the UiT campus!

Requirements:

- experience with figure skating coaching, preferably experience levels beyond Cubs
- work well in teams
- fluent in either Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, or English
- excellent planning skills

Tasks:

- coaching, on and off ice
- planning for weekly coaching sessions, aiming to develop each group of skaters
- preparing skaters for competitions
- travelling with skaters to competitions (depending on your capacity)
- program development
